- Doctors are encouraged to bring their own patients for surgical implant placement at Dr. Kim's private office in Diamond Bar, CA.
- Doctors must have valid CA dental license and proof of malpractice policy
- Cases must be treatment planned during the 4 sessions of this program
- The doctor will perform surgical procedure under supervision of Dr. Kim
- Dr. Kim, as an instructor will resume responsibility and liability of the case
- Treatment fee of \$800 for single case, or \$1,200 for multiple implants and/or complex surgical (GBR, sinus augmentation etc) will be paid to the facility. All supplies including implants, radiographs, regenerative materials and clinical support staff will be supplied by the facility (doctor has the discretion to charge the patient the UCR -usual, customary and regular - fee)
- Up to 8 cases may be accommodated throughout the day, and doctors are encouraged to pair up as surgeon/assistant teams
- Follow-up visits and restorative phase will be the responsibility of the attending doctor
